



## FARM911

EMERGENCY ACCESS POINT (EAP) PROGRAM

### **Keeping Farms in Hamilton Safe**



To learn more about the program and to enroll, visit hamilton.ca/addressing





- The Farm 911 EAP program improves emergency response to <u>vacant farmland</u> that does not have a municipal address.
- A unique Farm 911 EAP number will be assigned to vacant parcels of farmland that do not have a municipal address, helping emergency responders identify these properties more quickly, <u>improving</u> <u>response times during critical situations</u>.
- Those who enroll will receive a <u>red and</u> <u>white address sign</u> installed prominently at the existing field access point.
- One Farm 911 EAP number will be assigned <u>per existing access point</u>. (i.e., large properties with multiple access points)

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



### 5 Year Trends



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

# STORMWATER FUNDING STRUCTURE

What is Stormwater?

Rain, melting snow, and ice that washes off driveways, parking lots, roads, yards, rooftops, and other surfaces.<sup>1</sup>



### WHY A CHANGE IN STORMWATER FUNDING MODEL?

- New stormwater funding model in September 2025 Financially Sustainable
- Shifting to fee based on the amount of hard/impermeable surface on property Equitable
- The City cannot ignore the impacts of increasing stormwater projected in the coming years. A failure to act could lead to increased impacts on residents, such as an increase in basement flooding.

  Justifiable
- The fees paid through the program will also support projects that are part of Hamilton's Watershed Action Plan which aims to enhance watersheds and Hamilton Harbour conditions.

### WATER CONSUMPTION & ASSESSED VALUE

More municipal water use = more stormwater funding



### IMPERMEABLE SURFACES via STORMWATER FEE

Contributors to incremental stormwater pay a fair share

### RURAL STORMWATER MANAGEMENT

- Inspect, repair and replace culverts
- Rural stormwater ponds (inspection, maintenance and sediment removal)
- Invasive species control (e.g. Phragmites)
- Watercourses on City property (inspection, maintenance, rehabilitation)
- Roadside ditches maintenance for safe transportation in rural communities
- Early stages of surface water quality program to identify excess nutrients and improve health of our watershed

### STORMWATER FUNDING / RURAL EXPENDITURES

- To operate and maintain ageing infrastructure
  - \$43 Million (Total City of Hamilton 2023)
  - \$54 Million (Projected in 2025)

### 2023

- \$2.6M in rural drainage projects
- \$1.4M watercourse and drainage channel maintenance
- \$3.9M road related drainage / ditching (Rural & Urban)
- \$8.7M Conservation Authority Funding (City Wide)
- Rural Hamilton properties contributed ~\$1.5 million via \$60 per home from property taxes





### **Stormwater Management**

Planning, design, and implementation of systems that mitigate and control the impacts of human-made changes to runoff and other components of the hydrologic cycle.<sup>1</sup>









## BACKGROUND ON STORMWATER FUNDING FRAMEWORK

### A BRIEF HISTORY

- June 2023 Council approved a framework (based on Single Family Units) for transitioning to a stormwater fee, directing staff to engage public for consultation, including agricultural community
- Q4 2023 Consultant shares a proposal for agricultural properties to be subject to Industrial/Commercial/Institutional rates with a 50% discount.
  - Fees could be tens-of-thousands of dollars for large operations

### **Unacceptable Solution**

- Nov/Dec 2023 Rural Councillors collaborate on a motion to direct staff to review new options consistent with fair, equitable and justifiable principles. Moved by Councillor Cassar, motion passes unanimously.
  - Agricultural survey initiated and response deadline extended to early January

### **MOTION - STORMWATER FUNDING REVIEW**

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR C. CASSAR.....

WHEREAS, City staff have undertaken consultations with the community regarding the implementation of a Stormwater Incentives Program; and

WHEREAS, the rural community has expressed significant concern regarding the application of the Stormwater Rate Structure to agricultural properties;

### THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

- (a) That staff, in the report back regarding the implementation of a Stormwater Incentives Program, include specific recommendations regarding a stormwater rate structure and incentives program that recognizes rural agricultural properties as different from Industrial, Commercial, Institutional and Multi-Residential properties; and,
- (b) That staff <u>clearly explain the financial impacts of the stormwater rate structure and</u> <u>incentives program for rural agricultural properties</u>, including alignment to the Council approved guiding principles: Fair and equitable, Climate resilient and environmentally sustainable, Affordable and financially sustainable, Justifiable, and Simple.

- 2. Climate resilient & environmentally sustainable
- 3. Affordable & financially sustainable
- 4. Justifiable



### IMPERMEABLE UNITS — Average Residential Impervious Area

- 291 M<sup>2</sup> (Urban) = 1 Unit
- **596 M<sup>2</sup>** (Rural) = 2 Units but will be assigned factor of 1 unit
- Large residential and nonresidential to be assessed individually

1 unit = \$170 Stormwater fee

### **NEXT STEPS**

- Spring 2024 Staff will report back with updated recommendations for agricultural properties
  - Public delegation opportunity when the report is presented to General Issues Committee
  - Final policy to be approved by Council
- September 1, 2025 New Stormwater Funding structure is implemented
