Jerseyville Community Meeting

Jerseyville United Church - January 4, 2024

This informal community meeting was organized with a short lead time to address growing concerns about unsafe roads and dangerous driving in and around Jerseyville.

Attendees:

- Ward 12 Constituency Coordinator Sherri Brown
- ~45 community members

Summary

- Strong desire for a safer and more walkable community
 - Residents are eager to help Ward 12 Office to get action collect petitions, fundraising, advocacy, etc.
- Strong desire for playground replacement at Jerseyville Park

Areas of Concern

- Sunnyridge Road "S-Bend" many accidents here, driving too quickly around the bend, visibility is an issue.
 - **ACTION:** Speak with Road Safety Team what can be put in place for increased safety? Flashing lights to make signs more visible, guard rails, etc.
- Field Road and Powerline Road poor visibility due to overgrown trees and shrubs **ACTION:** Submit service request to Forestry
- Powerline Road between Field and Lynden blind spots because of the hills
 - **ACTION:** Speak with Road Safety Team can road markings be improved to discourage going into the oncoming lane? Other recommendations?
- Speeding/Aggressive driving, little enforcement
 - Jerseyville Road,
 - Field Road
 - Sunnyridge Road
 - o Lynden Road
 - Union Road cut-through traffic especially during school bus pick ups.
 - Alberton Road police enforcing here, but residents feel this is not the best spot given all the other feedback shared about other concerning locations.

ACTION: Follow up with Road Safety Team re: status of assessments and recommendations for all these areas

ACTION: Speak with Crime Manager to request enforcement on Union Road

ACTION: Speak with Road Safety Team - Investigate possibility of convex mirror at Union Road to improve visibility

• Drag racing along Jerseyville Road

ACTION: Connect with Crime Manager to request enforcement

- Alberton Road hard to turn on to Jerseyville Rd because of poor visibility.
 - **ACTION:** Speak with Road Safety Team investigate ways to slow traffic down before Alberton Road
- Field Road at Rail Trail speeding makes crossing dangerous.
 ACTION: Speak with Road Safety Team add pedestrian crossing? Improve lighting at signs?

Note: Some residents chose to leave before we proceeded to the following topic:

Jerseyville Park

- Great sense of nostalgia for the park that used to be a focal point for the community baseball diamonds removed; playground equipment is old.
- Unsafe to walk along Sunnyridge Road due to speeding.
 ACTION: Speak with Roads addition of signage indicating children at play? Park ahead? Other ways to create safer walkways for families?
- Current playground area is not accessible for those with mobility concerns.
- Cars driving onto the grass ruts are visible, doing "donuts".
 - **Note**: around noon on January 4th entry ways were blocked with concrete posts presumably to deter entry by vehicles.
- Dirt bikes are also an issue speeding, not wearing appropriate safety equipment. Resident reminded everyone to ensure their children were following expectations and behaving appropriately.
- Community is eager to have park improved offers of support, possible fundraising.
- Park is on City's list for replacement in 2027-28

ACTION: Are there grants available to help fund the playground? Councillor to investigate any opportunities to replace sooner

• Concern that playground equipment is unsafe – City staff have indicated the equipment meets CSA standards.

ACTION: Can report be shared with community to help alleviate concerns?

- Desire for community consultation prior to new playground being installed. ACTION: Determine timelines for community consultation
- Short-term idea ice rink ACTION: Speak with Parks to determine if this is a possibility – maintenance? Water?

Additional Comments

- Need for additional ways to communicate events with community posters on mailboxes? Other locations?
- Desire for a Jerseyville specific meeting with the Crime Manager ACTION: Connect with Crime Manager to coordinate dates
