Reporting to the City of Hamilton's Ward 12 Councillor, the summer Constituency Aid position is a learning opportunity for an individual interested in municipal politics and/or public service more broadly. The successful candidate will develop an understanding of the history, protocols, culture, and operations within the City of Hamilton creating a foundation for a future career in the Public Sector.

Employment Duration: Mid-June (flexible start date) to August 29, 2025

Hourly wage: \$21.30 (2025 Living Wage in Hamilton, ON)

Hours: 35 hours/week

Eligibility: Ages 15 to 30. A Canadian Citizen, permanent resident, or someone to whom Refugee Status has been granted/conferred.

Job Responsibilities The successful candidate will:

- Be responsible for 2-3 small projects. The work may involve interaction with City Staff, other elected officials, and members of the public. Assigned work will be customized to the skillset of the successful applicant.
- Assist with the analysis of qualitative and quantitative data using appropriate methods.
- Work with Ward 12 staff to monitor social media channels, profile and identify issues, and respond effectively and timely to online comments and questions.
- Contribute research and content development of *Craig's Current*, the Ward 12 monthly newsletter.
- Assist the Ward 12 Councillor in the preparation for Committee meetings by summarizing reports and conducting related research.
- Accompany the Ward 12 Councillor to committee meetings or public events for exposure and networking, as appropriate.

Required skills:

- Excellent written and verbal communication, and presentation skills.
- Political acuity, diplomacy, and people skills to enable successful interaction with elected officials, City Staff and the Public.
- Organizational and time management skills, including the ability to work with deadlines and competing
- Experience working with diverse stakeholders. Examples include not-for-profit social organizations, community groups, businesses, educational institutions.
- Problem-solving capacity related to the complexities of working with multiple stakeholders and the ability to relate well to a culturally diverse population.
- Experience with content creation (written, visual, video) is an asset.
